

OCEAN OPERATIONS EXERCISE – 2009



WHEN: April 27, 2008

WHERE: Goleta Beach

TIME: 1000 – 1400 hours

INTENT: To provide water rescue providers a chance to view and take part in exercises that will better familiarize them with the different equipment, techniques, and methods, used by the various agencies that could provide helicopter/vessel ocean rescue assistance within our County. Our main purpose for this years drill is to familiarize all participating agencies in the different methods in which to effect patient transfers from the crash site, to holding rafts, and then to the appropriate vessel/helicopter for transport to ALS providers on shore. Our County EMS agency will also take this opportunity to use our victims in a major on shore MCI drill as well.

SCENARIO: A Regional Jet carrying 50 persons has crashed 2 miles south east of the Goleta Pier while on it's down wind leg to Santa Barbara Airport.

DAYS EVENTS:

- Pre-exercise brief - 1000 hours
 1. Introductions.
 2. Safety message & emergency medical contingencies.
 3. Equipment overview, hoist ops overview, flight & vessel safety.
 4. Scenario over view
 5. Communications and medical plan.
 6. Q & A's.
- Exercise to commence per order of deployment as per briefing and information packet (ICS-201).
- Once exercise is completed, a debrief will take place in the East parking lot.
